Since 1901 the Blue Earth County Historical Society has been the only institution entirely dedicated to collecting, preserving, and exhibiting Blue Earth County History. There are now more than 15,000 objects of historic value in the Society's care, plus documents, written records, photographs, and biographical information that comprise the archives. It's entirely possible that your family or business is represented in our collection.

Nearly 10,000 people visited or made use of the Society's resources in 1987. They came from as far as Ireland and Australia, California, New Jersey and Texas.

Expansion and vitality do not come without cost. The new Heritage Center needs extensive remodeling to turn it into a facility appropriate to the county it reflects and the purposes it serves. Restoration of the Hubbard House will also be expensive, as anyone who has renovated an old house can attest. In addition, all this growth and progress require additional staffing and equipment.

The Blue Earth County Historical Society has tremendous potential. The people of the county will be enormously proud to have such an attraction right here at home. You will want to bring your friends and relatives to both facilities when they come from out of town to visit. Together we can make it happen.

In our 87-year history, we've never before asked the public or our members for capital funds. We've been working on this campaign for just about a year. 

The artifacts from the "county attic" are now being temporarily housed in the Heritage Center's auditorium while they are being cleaned and the records updated. Ordinarily museum storage areas are closed to public viewing, but we've decided to make an exception during our transition period. Is Your Heritage Worth 92 Cents A Day, More or Less?

Heritage Center will house a modern, professionally designed museum and research facility. Both will be leading visitor attractions for the area, important economic assets.
