Curation Notes

The BECHS Heritage Center Exhibit Gallery received a glorious initiation on August 21 when nearly 600 persons attended the Gallery's Grand Opening. Susan Stevens Chambers, President, BECHS Board of Trustees, cut the ribbon to the Gallery and Ian Stewart, Deputy Director of Interpretive Programs, Minnesota Historical Society, presented the keynote address. Major donors to the 1988 BECHS Capital Fund Drive addressed the visitors, after which everyone enjoyed an evening of discovery, music, and food.

Throughout the evening the individuals instrumental in the research and construction of the exhibition, including the BECHS Exhibit Committee, Jo Blatti of History Afield, and staff members of DisplayMasters, Inc. and BECHS were on hand to answer questions and to note the public's comments. They were delighted to learn that the public response to this new interpretive presentation of Blue Earth County's history was overwhelmingly positive.

But work in the Gallery has not come to an end. None of the exhibits within the Gallery are permanent.


Visitors to the Gallery will have noticed a few exhibit platforms, cases, and panels which have space for further artifacts or photographs; those will be added as they become available. For example, we would like to add clothing worn by local stonemasons or bricklayers to the exhibit on the county's quarrying and brickmaking industries. If and when those become available to us we will place them in the exhibit.

Also, we will periodically remove photographs and artifacts which are on exhibit and replace them with other examples from the collection. This rotation of the artifacts between exhibition and storage will make more of the BECHS collection available to the public, as well as provide for the long term conservation of the artifacts by removing them from exposure to light and other deterioration forces.

It would be impossible to tell the entire story of the county or to exhibit all of our artifacts and photographs at one time, no matter how large the Gallery. And, just as the development of Blue Earth County continually gives its citizens something more to discover, the BECHS Exhibit Gallery will continually give its visitors the opportunity for discovery.


